(Zetas Helping Other People Excel): Through Mind, Body, and Spirit.

HISTORY OF PSI OMICRON ZETA CHAPTER

To further the mission of the Sorority, on November 6, 2010, eight (8) zealous women chartered the Psi Omicron Zeta (POZ) Chapter of Manassas, VA serving Manassas and the surrounding areas. The charter members are: Mishta Brooks, Tameko Friend, Andrea Jones, Loleta Lewis, Judy Meekins, Trica Miles, Valanda Riley, and Kenya Whitener. The ladies of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc, Psi Omicron Zeta Chapter of Manassas are a group of women committed to excellence in all areas of life. We strive tirelessly to exude the ideals of our beloved organization and founders.

Since the chartering, the chapter has participated in various community service projects over the years. Some of the many community involvements and achievements of POZ include, but are not limited to mentoring young girls and teaching them leadership skills through three (3) youth auxiliaries' groups (Pearlettes, Amicettes and Archonettes) that was established for young ladies ranging from ages 4 to 18. 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INSTRUCTIONS

Before you begin the application form, please read the entire scholarship packet.

By reading through the scholarship packet first, you will have important insight into why this Scholarship was established, who is eligible to apply, qualifications, and how the reviewers will evaluate packets and select recipients.

To make it easy for the applicant and the review committee, use the application form, and create a title page for the essay topic. Please be sure to fill out the forms correctly. Please feel free to draw upon the expertise of people around you—High School career counselors, financial aid officers, teachers, parents, or friends who may have already been through the process and POZ members.

Again, late or incomplete applications will not be accepted. Furthermore, failure to follow instructions will lead to disqualification. Applicants who make false or misleading statements will be disqualified from the selection process.

HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS APPLICANTS

Scholarship recipients must attend their school's High School Senior Scholarship Awards program or other alternate location to receive the scholarship award. The Scholarship Committee requests that all completed application materials, including senior photo in a JPEG format, be submitted electronically to scholarshippsiomicronzeta1920@gmail.com by March 22, 2024, 11:59PM (EST).

- Pursuing an Undergraduate Academic Degree or Trade School
- Beginning college in the Fall 2024
- Minimum Cumulative GPA: 2.75 (out of 4.0)

- Actively involved in School Activities and Organizations (within the last two years)
- Community Service Involvement Report (within the last two years)
- Honors/Awards/Recognitions (within the last two years)
- Two (2) Letters of Recommendation
- Scholastic Record (school transcript)
- University/College Acceptance Letter to include Student ID#
- Applicants shall submit a typed essay in response to the topic below:

Why is mental health just as important as physical health and what are you doing to manage both?

 Applicants shall also submit a video link with essay submission in response to the topic below:

Who are you and what are you actively doing in your community to make a difference?

- The video should be engaging, fun and creative. Show your personality!
- The video should not include inappropriate, illegal, offensive images, sounds or content. Nor should it have violent or sexual content, it should be appropriate for a child.
- The video should be at least 1 minute, but no longer than 3 minutes.

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JUDGING CRITERIA

Scholarship essay submissions can receive a maximum score of 100 points, according to the following measurements:

Focus/Development – 40 points: The main message of the piece, the theme, with supporting details that enrich and develop the theme.

- Writing clear connection to the selected prompt.
- A topic is developed to fully respond to the prompt.

Conventions/Mechanics/Spelling – 25 points: The mechanical correctness of the piece; spelling, punctuation, capitalization, grammar usage, and paragraphing.

- Frequent errors will result in the loss of points.
- Provides transitions and variety of sentences.
- Accurate use of punctuation, grammar, and spelling in the essay.

Word Choice/Language – 10 points: The use of rich, colorful, and precise language that moves and enlightens the reader. The rhythm and flow of the language; the sound of word patterns; the way in which the writing plays to the ear, not just to the eye.

The student's word choice is formal and academic. Language is sophisticated, natural and not repetitious.

Originality/Organization – 10 points: The internal structure, thread of central meaning, logical and sometimes intriguing pattern or sequence of the ideas.

Personal Details – 10 points: The unique perspective of the writer evident in the piece with compelling ideas, engaging language, and revealing details - Multiple examples in the essay show the activities, skills, experiences, community service, awards, talents, major, future occupation, etc. of the student.

Word Count – 5 points: Meets the required minimum 500-word requirements.

EVALUATION CRITERIA

The evaluation will consider the applicant's entire package to include the essay, video, extracurricular activities and grades/GPA. Applicants that are active member of the Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity's Sigma Beta Club or Zeta Phi Beta Sorority Incorporated's Youth Auxiliary group (Archonettes) will receive an additional 10 points.
